Dear Hartlepool and Stockton-on-Tees Safeguarding Children Colleagues,

Welcome to this edition of the HSSCP newsletter, which aims to provide HSSCP Partners and Relevant Agencies with a summary of work undertaken by the Partnership during quarter three of 2023-2024.

Serious Incident Notification / Learning Requests:

1 serious incident notification was received during this quarter leading to a Rapid Review for this case being undertaken.

• Child KLT (Category: Fatal - Abuse) The rapid review agreed not to progress to a LCSPR.

LCSPR Updates:

JM:

• This LCSPR is now completed and the full report for <u>Child Joe</u> was published in December 2023. Recommendations from this review have been incorporated into the HSSCP combined learning action plan.

RV:

• The rapid review for this case was completed in November 2023 leading to a LCSPR. This LCSPR Learning Event is scheduled for 25th January 2024 and the Recall Event is scheduled for 26th February 2024.

Multi-agency Audit:

A multi agency audit to look into 'Step down from social care assessment' took place on 13th November 2023. The audit reviewed 6 cases with a range of demographics (3 cases from Hartlepool and 3 cases from Stockton on Tees). The audit report will be presented to the HSSCP Exec group in February 2024.

Work Streams:

The HSSCP Executive and Engine Room has continued to meet to progress the key priorities for the partnership:

1. Engagement of Children and Young People

□ Catalyst and HartlePower have commenced this piece of work. As part of this work they will consider the design and content of the HSSCP website from a child/young person perspective.

2. Strengthening Assurance

□ The Performance Management Framework (PMF) task & finish group have developed a quality assurance framework and are developing key performance criteria and reviewing options for software for the PMF.

Progress made this quarter in relation to the partnerships main priority of Neglect:

1. Evidencing the Child's Lived Experience

□ Neglect Champions regularly meet to undertake work to progress this priority.

2. Assessing and Intervening with Neglect – Understanding and responding to the Impact of Neglect

Neglect Champions are:

- □ Planning a Neglect of Children Conference.
- □ Reviewing and updating the rough guides for practitioners which is a set of tools utilised by frontline practitioners who assess families in their role.

3. Communication and Engagement

□ Ongoing marketing campaign for Neglect of Children via various media i.e. posters; social media; newsletters; etc.

□ Delivering of Neglect Active Learning event to ensure key messages from case reviews are embedded in working practices.



HSSCP Training

The latest HSSCP annual safeguarding children training programme for April 2023 to March 2024 is available. This includes a full programme of safeguarding children training with bookings now made via a new online booking system.

Also, included in the programme is the e-learning courses from the Tees Safeguarding All MeLearning platform. Further information on how to register for an e-learning account and to enrol on any of the e-learning courses can be found here.

HSSCP continues to provide a hybrid model of both face to face and virtual delivery of the safeguarding children training courses they offer. In this quarter 5 face to face/in-person and 10 virtual training sessions have been held, covering a range of safeguarding topics and themes.

HSSCP is working with STSCP to develop a programme of multi-agency safeguarding training which is delivered Teeswide to ensure key messages are received across all agencies within the Tees area

Tees Safeguarding Children Conferences:

The Child Sexual Abuse Expertise & Barnardos are currently planning a Child Sexual Abuse Roadshow on behalf of HSSCP & STSCP.

HSSCP is also planning a themed a multi-agency conference to be delivered in 2024 on Neglect of Children & Young People.
